

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

The Coal Mine theatre is located in the traditional territory of many nations including the Mississaugas of the Credit, the Anishnabeg, the Chippewa, the Haudenosaunee and the Wendat peoples. This region is covered by Treaty 13 signed with the Mississaugas of the Credit, and the Williams Treaties signed with multiple Mississaugas and Chippewa bands.

Matchstick Theatre is from Kjipuktuk, meaning Great Harbour, located within unceded Mi'kma'ki. This territory is covered by the "Treaties of Peace and Friendship" which Mi'kmaq Wəlastəkwiyik (Maliseet), and Passamaquoddy Peoples first signed with the British Crown in 1726.

It is our shared responsibility to learn about the ongoing process of truth and reconciliation with the original caretakers of our land.

CONTENT AND SESNORY WARNINGS

ALLERGY ALERT: During the show, food will be served onstage containing small amounts of seafood (haddock fish).

There will also be one herbal cigarette smoked (in two different instances) during the performance. The cigarettes are a cocoa bean blend, but still smell quite strong.

Anyone concerned with either of these elements is encouraged to sit further from the stage, and we will also have face masks available on site. We are happy to refund tickets for those who don't feel comfortable attending with these conditions.

CONTENT WARNINGS: Leaving Home contains intense moments that may make audiences uncomfortable, and the incredibly close nature of Matchstick's production may heighten this experience.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Leaving Home is about unrequited love. Expressions of love can be hard; sometimes they don't come at all. Here love flows like a subterranean river.

We are and are not our parents. When we're young, they influence us in subtle and obvious ways. We can't help but be like them, yet there comes a time when we resist and discover ourselves. A week before rehearsals in Toronto, I became a father for the second time. Two years ago, when my daughter Alice was born, I was gifted clarity, identity, and purpose. It was a moment of division: then and now, before and after, there and here. I was remade. Even now I worry: what happens—who do I become—when my children grow up and leave? How will I reconcile their reality when it's bound to be different from the world I've known? *Leaving Home* is full of transitional moments where established identities come apart and new ones take their place. Through his honesty and specificity, David French has created a universal work of art which echoes across generations.

Thank you to my parents, siblings, wife, children, and friends for helping make me who I am.

Thank you to Alex and Chelsea for believing from the beginning.

Thank you Ted for giving us the opportunity to stage our production at the Coal Mine.



He is now an accomplished performer who has worked with many of Nova Scotia's most acclaimed companies including Mocean Dance, Halifax Theatre for Young People, Eastern Front Theatre, Villains Theatre, Zuppa, Workshirt Opera, Shakespeare By the Sea, 2b Theatre, Two

Planks and a Passion Theatre and Symphony Nova Scotia's production of *The Nutcracker*. This is his third collaboration with Matchstick Theatre after performing in their productions of *Bone Cage* and *The Woodcutter*. His most recent performance was in Winnipeg for Chartier Danse in a production of *Fracas* by Margaret Sweatman. His screen credits include *Sullivan's Crossing, The Good House, Chapelwaite, Diggstown* and *Black Cop*. Sébastien is also the Festival Director for Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax, a writer and collaborator for PEI's River Clyde Pageant and the former Executive Director of the Bus Stop Theatre Co-op.



Andrew Musselman:

Andrew Musselman (he/him) is an actor, writer and entrepreneur based in Toronto. As a writer, he co-created and sold an original tv series to AMC Studios. As an actor, he received a Beinecke Fellowship from Yale School of Drama and has been nominated for a Dora Award for his performance in Catalpa. Canadian Film Centre Toronto, Women In

Lab NYC, and most recently, the Whistler
Film Festival's Producer's Lab.
Recent screen credits include: CBC TV's
MOONSHINE, CTV's SULLIVAN'S CROSSING
and the web-series TOKENS. Thompson is
a multiple ACTRA/Gemini-winner for her

roles in *TRAILER PARK BOYS*, features *SPLINTERS* (Thom Fitzgerald) and *THE CHILD REMAINS* (Michael Melski). Stage work includes The Royal National Theatre (UK), the ATF, The Shaw Festival, The Neptune, PTE, Festival Antigonish, Bristol Old Vic and...her last time on stage in Toronto - *TAMARA*, (Neccessary Angel).

Thompson's first feature film (Writer/Director of *DAWN*, *HER DAD & THE TRACTOR*) is on platforms including Amazon Prime, and won NS's MASTERWORKS Prize in November 2022. A new doc series, *TRANSLATIONS*, was released on Fibe TV and moves to CBC Gem this Pride month.

Her first novel, *ROAR*, was published by Nimbus/ Vagrant Press in 2023, and her second book *WINTER SKY* - a short story collection - will be published this fall.

WhatbyWhen (WxW) (with Crystal Lee),


where they develop models for sustainable production management and technical direction through praxis ($\underline{\text{whatxwhen.ca}}$).
